Innovative Practices For Municipal Waste Reduction



Opportunities for Municipal Ecosystem Services




According to the Ellen MacArthur Foundation, a new economic mind-set is emerging and the foundation says this new model is worth at least a trillion dollars. This new model involves designing new product to last longer as well as the reuse of existing materials in old product that is no longer useful. Check out the Circular Design Guide website and see what individuals, businesses, communities, and manufacturers can do to reduce and eventually eliminate waste.

A circular economy is an industrial system that is restorative or regenerative by intention and design. It replaces the end-of-life concept with restoration, shifts towards the use of renewable energy, eliminates the use of toxic chemicals, which impair reuse and return to the biosphere, and aims for the elimination of waste through the superior design of materials, products, systems, and business models.

Several organization in Canada and Alberta are working toward a circular economic model that expands on the "reduce, reuse, recycle" model of waste reduction. Check out some of these organizations in the *Spotlighted Organizations* below.



In honour of Waste Reduction Week in Canada, the Recycling Council of Ontario created some Waste Reduction Resource Kits to provide information, tips, and activities relating reducing, reusing, and recyling for businesses, schools, and municalities.
